

This topographic map depicts the Nandgaon Mohalla, a village in the Khed sub-division of Bhadrachal district, Madhya Pradesh. The map is bounded by coordinates 73°22'30"E to 73°23'30"E and 17°42'0"N to 17°43'0"N. It shows a dense network of land parcels, many of which are numbered. The terrain is characterized by contour lines, with elevations ranging from approximately 120 meters to 484 meters. Key features include:

- Surrounding Areas:** Suseri to the north, Khed_(bhadgaon) to the northeast, Bhoste to the east, Alsare to the southeast, and Diwalewadi to the west.
- Internal Labels:** Dhakti_Suseri, Nandgaon, Khari, Khad, and Alsare_Kh.
- Infrastructure:** A network of roads, including a prominent yellow line running through the center, and a railway line (MOR 14373) crossing the lower part of the map.
- Topography:** Contour lines indicate a hilly or uneven terrain, with higher elevations in the northwest and lower elevations in the southeast.
